

COOKIE POLICY

Last Updated: 13th July, 2026.

This Cookie Policy explains how **Elycrox Global Ltd.** (“FURY”, “Company”, “we”, “our”, or “us”) uses cookies and similar technologies in connection with the FURY™ platform, website, applications, competitions, digital experiences, and related services (collectively referred to as the “Platform”).

This Policy should be read together with the Terms of Service and Privacy Policy.

By continuing to use the Platform, you acknowledge and consent to the use of cookies and related technologies in accordance with this Policy, subject to any preferences or settings you may choose to apply.

1. INTRODUCTION

- a. Cookies and similar tracking technologies help us operate the Platform efficiently, improve user experience, analyse performance, support security functions, personalise content, and better understand how users interact with our services.
- b. Certain cookies are essential for the operation of the Platform, while others support analytics, advertising, functionality, audience engagement, and performance optimisation.

2. WHAT ARE COOKIES?

- a. Cookies are small text files placed on a device, browser, or system when a user visits a website or interacts with online services.
- b. Cookies may collect information relating to:
 - I. browser activity;
 - II. session information;
 - III. device identifiers;
 - IV. preferences and settings;
 - V. usage behaviour;
 - VI. authentication status;
 - VII. engagement patterns.
- c. Cookies may be temporary or persistent depending on their function and configuration.

3. TYPES OF COOKIES WE USE

We may use different categories of cookies and related technologies, including the following:

a. Essential Cookies

These cookies are necessary for the operation, security, and basic functionality of the Platform.

- i. They may be used to:
 - maintain login sessions;
 - authenticate users;
 - protect against fraudulent activity;
 - enable navigation and core platform functionality.
- ii. Without these cookies, certain features of the Platform may not function properly.

b. Performance and Analytics Cookies

These cookies help us understand how users interact with the Platform.

- i. They may collect information relating to:
 - pages visited;
 - time spent on the Platform;
 - engagement patterns;
 - technical performance;
 - error tracking;
 - traffic sources.
- ii. Analytics information helps improve functionality, stability, design, and user experience.

c. Functional Cookies

These cookies allow the Platform to remember user preferences and customised settings.

- i. Such preferences may include:
 - language selection;
 - region preferences;
 - saved settings;
 - user interface customisation.

d. Advertising and Marketing Cookies

- i. These cookies may be used to support promotional campaigns, advertising effectiveness, audience targeting, and social media integration.
- ii. They may track interactions across websites, platforms, devices, or campaigns.
- iii. Third-party advertising or analytics providers may place certain cookies subject to their own policies and practices.

e. Security Cookies

- i. Security-related cookies help detect suspicious activity, unauthorised access attempts, fraudulent behaviour, abuse of voting systems, or platform manipulation.
- ii. These cookies support the integrity and security of the FURY™ ecosystem.

4. SIMILAR TECHNOLOGIES

- a. In addition to cookies, we may use related technologies such as:
 - i. web beacons;
 - ii. tracking pixels;
 - iii. SDKs;
 - iv. embedded scripts;
 - v. session identifiers;
 - vi. local storage technologies.
- b. These technologies may perform functions similar to cookies and may be used for analytics, authentication, advertising, security, or operational purposes.

5. HOW WE USE COOKIES

- a. Cookies and related technologies may be used for purposes including:
 - I. operating and securing the Platform;
 - II. maintaining user sessions;
 - III. remembering user preferences;
 - IV. improving platform functionality;
 - V. preventing fraud and abuse;
 - VI. measuring audience engagement;
 - VII. analysing platform performance;
 - VIII. supporting voting integrity systems;
 - IX. personalising content and user experience;
 - x. facilitating advertising and marketing activities.
- b. We may also use aggregated or anonymised information derived from cookies for business analytics and operational improvement.

6. THIRD-PARTY COOKIES

- a. Certain third-party services integrated into the Platform may place their own cookies or tracking technologies.
- b. Such third parties may include:
 - i. analytics providers;
 - ii. payment processors;
 - iii. advertising networks;

- iv. social media platforms;
 - v. video hosting providers;
 - vi. streaming or broadcast partners.
- c. We do not control third-party cookies and are not responsible for the privacy practices of external providers.
- d. Users are encouraged to review the policies of relevant third parties where applicable.

7. COOKIE CONSENT

- a. Where required by Applicable Laws, users may be presented with cookie notices, consent banners, preference tools, or opt-in mechanisms.
- b. By continuing to use the Platform after receiving such notice, users may be deemed to have consented to the use of certain cookies in accordance with this Policy, except where consent is withdrawn or preferences are modified.

8. MANAGING COOKIE PREFERENCES

- a. Users may manage, restrict, disable, or delete cookies through browser settings, device controls, or available consent management tools on the Platform.
- b. Most browsers allow users to:
 - i. view stored cookies;
 - ii. delete cookies individually or collectively;
 - iii. block cookies from specific websites;
 - iv. restrict third-party cookies;
 - v. disable cookies entirely.
- c. The method for managing cookies varies depending on the browser or device being used.
- d. Users should note that disabling certain cookies may affect functionality, accessibility, user experience, or the proper operation of some parts of the Platform.

9. DO-NOT-TRACK SIGNALS

- a. Certain browsers or devices may provide “Do Not Track” settings or similar privacy controls.
- b. At this time, the Platform may not respond uniformly to all such signals due to the absence of a universally accepted technical standard.

- c. We may continue to review industry developments and applicable legal requirements relating to such mechanisms.

10. INTERNATIONAL USERS

- a. The Platform may be accessed from jurisdictions outside Nigeria.
- b. Users acknowledge that information collected through cookies and related technologies may be processed or stored in jurisdictions with different data protection laws.
- c. Where international data transfers occur, reasonable safeguards may be implemented in accordance with Applicable Laws and internal compliance measures.

11. DATA PROTECTION AND PRIVACY

- a. Information collected through cookies and related technologies may constitute Personal Data under applicable privacy laws.
- b. Such information shall be handled in accordance with the Platform's Privacy Policy and applicable legal obligations relating to data protection, security, and lawful processing.
- c. Where legally required, users may have rights relating to access, deletion, objection, restriction, or withdrawal of consent concerning Personal Data collected through cookies.

12. SECURITY AND FRAUD PREVENTION

- a. Certain cookies and tracking technologies are necessary to maintain the security and integrity of the Platform.
- b. These technologies may assist in:
 - i. detecting suspicious activity;
 - ii. preventing automated abuse;
 - iii. maintaining voting integrity;
 - iv. identifying fraudulent access attempts;
 - v. protecting user accounts and systems.
- c. Disabling certain security-related cookies may affect the availability or functionality of some Platform services.

13. CHANGES TO THIS COOKIE POLICY

- a. We reserve the right to amend, revise, update, or modify this Cookie Policy at any time.

- b. Changes may be published through the Platform or communicated through other appropriate channels.
- c. Continued use of the Platform following publication of revised terms constitutes acknowledgement of the updated Cookie Policy.

14. GOVERNING LAW

This Cookie Policy shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

15. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- a. Any dispute arising out of or relating to this Cookie Policy shall first be addressed through good faith discussions between the Parties.
- b. Where the matter remains unresolved within fourteen (14) days, the dispute shall be referred to mediation at the Lagos Multi-Door Courthouse (LMDC).
- c. If unresolved after mediation, the matter may be referred to the courts of competent jurisdiction in Lagos State, Nigeria.
- d. Nothing in this clause shall prevent the Company from seeking urgent protective or injunctive relief where necessary.

16. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Cookie Policy is determined to be invalid, unlawful, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
